After the return of our Browning, Montana Immersion, Br. Paul Ackermann, the President of the De La Salle Blackfeet Middle School wrote to us: "Thank you for yet another wonderful group. They didn't let a little snow daunt their enthusiasm, and did some great work for the school. Their assistance in classes was much appreciated. Thanks for the obvious planning and preparation that went into their experience." Their "little snow" was -40° weather. We are proud of the over 50 students who have or will be our hands of ministry to those in need and who benefitted by our four service immersion experiences. For many of them, they are able to balance honor level grades, as recently recognized at our Honor Awards Assembly for their first semester grades.

Br. Paul noticing our "planning and preparation" can be applied to many aspects of our school life. Here are some highlights of which to take special note:

Admissions: Over 65 8th graders have applied and taken the entrance test. Interviews are this coming Sat., Feb. 9. We are still accepting applications for both incoming grade 9 and transfer students into grade 10 and 11 (and, in special cases, 12). Please encourage families and students to inquiry into La Salle.

Pick-a-Thon— we need an orchard or two: Our Northwest Harvest orchard was removed and is being replaced by housing. If you have a piece of an orchard that will produce multiples of 40 bins of apples (4 classes picking 40 bins each), please let me know. First Harvest, which coordinates the attainment of orchard harvests for Northwest Harvest, would then be notified. Side note: David Bobanick or First Harvest came by to seek our advice

on how to run a Pick-a-thon, in order for him to help a Rotary in New Orleans set up an orange picking plan that will help feed those in need there. Our schools in the New Orleans area were contacted to assist them.

Registration: Do take note of the registration timelines that prepare for 2008-2009. Tuition will increase its usual 5% after last year's 3% hiatus.

Summer: We will have a summer program for incoming 9th graders and for the sports and science camps we ran last year. If there is a possibility/feasibility to expand programs, we might be able to do so. We are still stabilizing our return to summer programs, as last year was our first year since the previous summer program in 2003.

Parent Volunteer Hours: In order to alleviate the surge of work in the finance office, the coordination of the volunteer hour forms has been moved from Mrs. Soptich to Mrs. Paniagua in the Main Office. Our plan is to provide an update to parents of hours served with each 6 week progress report, beginning with our next report.

Thank you to the parents who did a quick money collection before the Riverside game and gave it to the Pynch family. Mrs. Pynch has been suffering with brain cancer and her sons play on the team. After the game, Mr. McMillan organized a prayer in the locker room with the two teams, in order to support the Pynch boys. Jesus lives in our hearts and actions.

Our teachers are committed to the success of each and every student at La Salle!



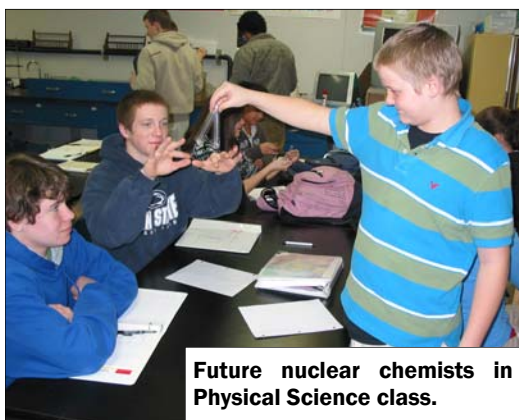

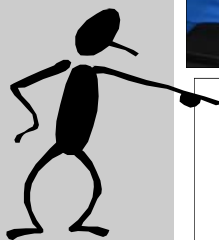

Preparation for 2008-2009

Course Preference Surveys were be handed out at the assembly following Catholic School Week Liturgy on Friday, February 1. The survey indicates the courses they would like to take next year, keeping in mind La Salle's graduation requirements and college entrance requirements. This is not class registration. It helps us prepare for next year by letting us know the areas of greatest need and interest. The results are used to determine which classes will be offered for the March class registration process. Students and parents will sign the completed course preference survey. Surveys are due Tuesday, February 5.

Registration for 2008-2009 classes will take place in March. After an orientation for the students on March 17, the online registration opens on Tuesday, March 18 and closes on Wednesday, March 26. Students and their parents use their passwords to access online registration through PowerSchool. The step-by-step directions are included on the online registration screen. They lead you through the process. The directions are grade specific and must be followed exactly. As we progress in the process, students and parents will sign a verification form in late April.

Planning Ahead – First Semester F Grades:

Students receiving any F grades so far this year, need to start planning their summer vacation around summer school. The Student-Parent Handbook says: "No student will be readmitted to La Salle High School in the fall with an F for a semester grade in any subject. All semester F grades must be made up by attendance at a summer school or online program approved by the Dean of Studies." It is the student's responsibility to ensure that the grade (s) and credit(s) earned in summer school be sent to the La Salle Registrar for inclusion on the transcript prior to the start of the 2008-2009 school year. Make-up for F grades may not be postponed until a later time. Additional summer school opportunities and information should be available after Spring Break in April.
